An American passport is your ticket to travel around the world. If you haven't traveled internationally before, or you traveled to Canada before passports were needed, you may not be aware of what passports really are, how they work, or how to get one. Getting a U.S. passport for the first time can be quite easy and only takes a few hours to work and a quick photo of yourself. Click here for the first time on the accelerated U.S. Passport Service >>Passport Compatibility Requirements In order to be eligible for a U.S. passport, you must be at least 16 years of age and a U.S. citizen or a non-citizen of the National.Depending on what you have, you must provide various evidence of your eligibility. You are a U.S. citizen if one of the following Apply: You are a non-citizen citizen if one after Apply: You were born in the United States You were born in American Samoa, your elder is a U.S. citizen * You were born in the Commonwealth of Northern Mariana And you have made the election to be treated as a U.S. citizen and not a U.S. citizen. You're a former foreigner who is naturalized as a U.S. citizen You were born in Puerto RicoYou were born in GuamYou were born in the U.S. Virgin Islands * See the details of the Child Citizenship ActIf you are born overseas to parents who are U.S. citizens, your parents must complete the CRBA form (FS-240) and submit to the nearest U.S. Embassy to secure your citizenship. This process is crucial to avoid questions about obtaining citizenship. It is best to apply for a passport at the same time, so there are no issues getting back to America. To apply for a US passport, you must complete the following steps:Step 1: Complete the official application for an American passport on the U.S. Government Form DS-11. Government forms always have threatening-sounding names, but this form is quite simple. Upper half of passport application form DS-11. You must fill it out on paper or online and print it and bring it with you for processing. Do not sign your application until Agent, otherwise you'll have to re fill out the form. The passport book is a little more expensive, but there are no restrictions. However, the map is very convenient for you to travel in these selected countries. The passport book has either a standard 28 pages or an expanded 52 pages. If you plan to travel a lot, get a 52-page passport. For most people, there's a lot of 28 pages, considering you'll probably need to update before filling it out. However, if you need more pages, the U.S. government will send you a new passport versus adding pages to your current one. To obtain a copy of the required request form, you can print from home or print in the local library. You can also receive the application where you submit your application. If you plan to receive the request and submit everything in one trip, make sure you have completed all the other steps. Step 2: Provide evidence of US citizenship or non-US citizenship. It's better to be ready, so try to bring as much information as possible! Here's where knowing your eligibility status is important. Various evidence is needed for those (1) born in the United States (Citizens), (2) born outside the United States (Citizens), (3) born outside the United States (naturalized), and (4) born outside the United States (adopted). American citizens born in the U.S. or are u.s. national, you just need to present a certified birth certificate. Make sure it's not a copy of your birth certificate. If your certificate is not presented more than a year after your birth, or you do not have one, you must also provide a combination of the following: Baptism or circumcision CertificateA Hospital BirthInsurance FilesPublished Birth Announcements (newspapers, etc.) Notarial affidavits or DS-10 (Birth Affidavit) in addition to some of the above All evidence must be official and signed all relevant information to you. U.S. citizens born outside the United States are not attacked by fs-240 Proof. Alternatively, you can present your foreign birth certificate with proof of your parents' nationality and marriage, and a signed affidavit showing all the places where your parents lived and outside the U.S. before birth. Those born outside the United States and who are naturalized shall present their certificate of naturalization or citizenship certificate. For those who were born outside the United States and who claim citizenship through naturalization of their parents, you must submit a few things: Your parents naturalization certificateele foreign birth certificate, official translation of your birth certificate, if necessary Proof of your admission to the U.S. Your parent's marriage certificate or proof they were in custody of you For those who were born outside the United States and accepted, you need proof of habitual residence, your adoption and proof of your U.S. citizen's parental custody. While this may already seem like a lot, make sure to bring other official documents that you think may be relevant to whether you are a U.S. citizen born in countries or abroad. The Website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs lists the secondary evidence. It is important to note that social security cards are not considered as evidence. Step 3: To present identification, the identification certificate is a little easier and less daunting than proof of citizenship. Proof of identity must be something with a good photo of you and your signature. It must be a permanent identification form, not a temporary card, and must be an official U.S. government-issued form ID. If you present an identity document from the outside, you must also provide a secondary ID form with the relevant information provided on your first identification form. If you are unable to provide this official information, or if you have a name change, you must provide the correct secondary evidence. Step 4: Submit photocopies of the evidenceAdsthea need all official documents with you when you submit your application, you will also need copies of each document you submit so there is a copy of your documentation submitted in the application. Before submitting your application, you will receive a copy of all the primary and secondary evidence you are taking with you. Then you can give anything they ask. Make separate copies of each certificate. Copies shall be on the front and back of each certificate, shall be on 8,5x11 white paper and shall be on only one side of the current paper. Finally, you may not reduce the size of any of the copied pictures, but you can increase them if you want. Although some facilities offer photo-taking services, it is easiest to do so before the deadline. Per per you only need to give them one photo. The photo must be a high-quality color photo of you taken in the last 6 months, and 2 x2 size. You must wear regular street clothes and do not wear headdress or glasses if worn for religious reasons and documented as such. Since there are more passport photo requirements, it is easiest to simply get a photo taken at an institution that offers passport photo service. Typical places to get them into include large pharmacies, department stores, government offices, and more. If you want to do this yourself, follow these instructions to take your passport photo at home. You can search for other places in your area as well as through services like Yelp. The photos cost anywhere from about \$6 to 15 and have an additional passport application fee. If you want to get your passport up-and-down, you can do so with an additional \$60 fee. The overnight delivery service will receive \$14.85, which will overnight your passport from the date on which it is approved. The Wizard for this link has the ability to search for places near you, including places also provide photo services. The United States Postal Service (USPS) offices allow you to submit applications. Click the link to search for the nearest office. For those travelling for two weeks or needing an external visa for four weeks, you must visit the passport agency. These are unfortunately few and far between, and may be anywhere near where you are located.26 U.S. Passport Agency locations If you can't make it to passport agency and still need it to speed up, or just wish someone else would help you speed up the process, you can also use a private passport accelerator like Swift Passport and Visa Services.There is a great article that explains how to use Private Passport Expediter. Please note that the use of such a service must be carefully used. The expected delivery time of your passport may vary greatly. But expect it to take at least 3 weeks if you have this standard delivery, and it can actually take up to a month or two depending on how backed up they are. Standard time is about 4-6 weeks. This can be longer if there are many backorders. The accelerated order should arrive within three weeks, but may also take longer. If you go to the Passport Agency, their estimated turnaround time is eight days. The use of a private company can speed it up even less, arguably even 48 hours. Be sure to check your online passport status from time to time if you don't need it right away. You will view your application using your last name, date of birth, and the last four digits of your Social Security number. If you get your passport accelerated, it's important to know that the online status tool probably won't work for at least a week. If you can speed up your passport, it is highly recommended to get the contact details of all those you are talking to or the agency you work with and often call them to see the status of your passport. Sometimes there's nothing you can do to speed it up. As a government process, you can assume that it takes a little longer than normal and has minimal customer service. Therefore, it is highly recommended that you apply for your passport well in advance of each upcoming trip! Bonus Tip: A useful tool for Passport ProcessIf you want a useful tool to help you through the process, you can use the State Departments app wizard. This is not an official application, but it will help you figure out what you need. In special cases (minors, outside the US)For the first time, there are some specific cases: minors under the age of 16, minors aged 16 and 17 and people applying outside the US. You can get your kids a passport. You have to go with them and fill out the paperwork. as well as guarantee them to parents. Then their passports are only good for five years. Image Credit: michaeljung via ShutterstockProcess for a minor under 16If you are under 16 years of age or you submit an application to a minor under the age of 16, there is additional evidence to be provided with the application, and the passport is only five years instead of standard 10. If you apply for a minor under 16 years of age, , you must provide proof of nationality with parental proof of relationship; should also be applied in person. The parent relationship can be documented on the child's birth certificate, which can double as proof of nationality. The identification of the photograph may be covered by the parent's or child id, if it is theirs. Parental consent must be given to persons under the age of 16 and cannot be applied alone. Both parents must be present and give their consent, if any. If not, the other must submit a DS-3053: consent application form. If there is only one guardian, a certificate can be presented by issuing a valid court order or death certificate. The passport fee for a minor is slightly lower at \$80 for a book, \$15 for a card, \$95 for both, and a standard \$25 processing fee. The process of becoming a 16- and 17-year-old Although it is still considered to be a minor, a 16-year-old or 17-year-old child may apply for a passport independently if they have the relevant documents, including their identity document. The child must submit an application for DS-11. If the child does not yet have his/her identity document, an identity document must be accompanied to identify him or her. They don't have both parents present when the child is 16 or 17 years old. In order to show parental awareness, it is recommended that at least one parent be present. Another way to show parental awareness is to give the child a written letter of consent signed with a copy of the parents' photo ID. Standard adult rates for children 16 or 17 years old are subject to standard adult rates. The application process for a U.S. citizen or U.S. citizen is located outside the U.S. If you are trying to apply for a U.S. passport, and you are located outside the U.S. and are a U.S. citizen or citizen, the process is very similar to the process if you were applying within the U.S. However, you must apply through the nearest US embassy or consulate. As with the above process, you must complete the application and collect

all relevant documents to bring with you. Passport photos have different requirements depending on which country you are in, so be sure to follow the photo requirements for your US passport. Passport fees same, but you must use cash in either USD or local currency that will be converted. No other payment methods can be used. A quick pass cannot be applied for outside the United States. However, if the reason for applying for a passport is an emergency, the embassy or agency may issue a passport with a limited period of validity to service your emergency.
